THE SAN FRANCISCO FALL ANTIQUES SHOW

LITQUAKE!

San Franciscans spend twice the national average on books (and booze). From this impressive statistic emerged Litquake, an annual nine-day literary extravaganza since 2002. This year's festivities include readings by 800 authors—big-name locals Dave Eggers and Joyce Maynard making appearances—and the trademarked LitCrawl through the Mission, complete with stops at a bike store, barbershop, and bowling alley. Get the event on your books, especially the Literary Death Match (a humorous competition between short-story writers) and Goodreads' twist on a traditional Pub Quiz. *Oct. 5-13; litquake.org.*

LOS ANGELES ANTIQUES ART + DESIGN SHOW

Open to Contemporary Art and 21st-century design for the first time, the anticipated social and shopping event displays elegant wares (from more than 60 exhibitors) and a spectacular installation from emerging architects Dwayne Oyler and Jenny Wu.
